

HEATERS & M FIREPLACES



GAS & ELECTRIC HEATERS

1. Keep heaters on a dry, flat and even surface and at least 1 metre away from surrounding objects

2. Ensure cords are not damaged and are well-organised to minimise trip and strangulation hazards for children

3. Ensure the room is well-ventilated when the heater is operating

Do not leave heaters unattended. Turn the heater off if you are going to sleep or leaving the house

If you smell gas, turn off the heater immediately and contact your gas supplier







FIREPLACES & BARBECUES



Carbon monoxide poisoning is a serious health risk. Heating devices labelled for outdoor use should not be used indoors

Call an authorised professional to check that all vents and chimneys are clean and free from blockages

Fireplaces, heaters and barbeques should be used in well-ventilated areas
